Headaches

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HEADACHE is a symptom of numerous affections both of the nervous system and of other parts of the body. Its frequency is so great and its causes so many that to discuss adequately this one symptom, involves the differential diagnosis of almost all neurological diseases. The seriousness of this symptom varies from that of malignant headaches which require consideration from the neurologist even though, as a group, they produce only annoying and unsatisfactory problems with which he has to deal. To determine the etiology of obscure headaches requires extreme precision and frequently enough these etiological studies are inconclusive and empirical.

MIGRAINE is more commonly known as sick headache, and is always associated with nausea and the term has been used

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
